Multi-award-winning theatre company Chronic Insanity, the team behind the critically acclaimed fringe hit 24, 23, 22, return to Omnibus Theatre in January 2026 with a potent and provocative new play. Written by Doug Deans and directed by Kathleen O'Dougherty, Mother.Dad is a raw, dramatic, and sometimes humorous look at love, parenthood, class, and the sheer madness of raising a family in the 21st century.

THE SOUND OF ABSENCE

When Lenore's father passes away, she is overcome with memories and rage forcing her to confront her identity and belonging. In order to rebuild herself, Lenore embarks on a solitary journey through time accompanied by poetry and a mysterious doppelganger-pianist.

A hauntingly beautiful new experimental musical theatre piece, The Sound of Absence explores the intricate bond between father and daughter — and the unspoken reasons behind the choices our parents make.

Blending live piano, spoken word, and movement, this immersive performance transforms the stage into a landscape of sound and emotion. Music and narrative become inseparable: a single story told through two voices — one spoken, one played.

Minimalist yet emotionally charged production invites the audience into a deeply personal space where love, loss, and reconciliation unfold in real time.

The heart of the organisation's ambitious programme lies in classics re-imagined, modern revivals and new writing. Omnibus Theatre also provides a platform for LGBTQ+ work and aims to give voice to the underrepresented and challenge perceptions.
